Introduction

The Lochcarron Hotel is a family-run hotel of four generations and is one of the central meeting places in the area for tourists and locals alike.

Formerly a drovers' inn, the hotel retains most of its traditional character, with the original part of the building dating back to the 1880's.



The picturesque village of Lochcarron lies in the heart of Wester Ross, one of the most beautiful areas of mainland Scotland. The village, with a population of approximately 900,

stretches for 2.5 miles along the tidal shoreline and is reputed to be the longest village in Scotland.

Being located on the West Coast of Scotland, the weather is often much milder than many people expect due to the effects of the Gulf Stream. Snow falls for only one to two weeks each year and transforms the village into a winter wonderland. Whatever the time of year, the weather often creates a dramatic view of one kind or another.





Accommodation

The Hotel has 11 letting rooms available. All the rooms are comfortable, spacious and all except one are equipped with private facilities. All have colour television and complimentary tea/coffee tray. 6 of the rooms have superb sea views, looking across Loch Carron towards Attadale. One room has wheelchair access and wet room.

Lounge Bar

The lounge bar, complete with welcoming open fire, offers stunning panoramic views across the loch and is the perfect place to relax.



There is usually a choice of at least two traditional real ales and a selection of around 60 single malt whiskies. There are regular live music sessions.

There is a bar menu available from 12 noon through to 9pm and chef's specials are usually available on most days, too.



Dining

The Head Chef has created delicious menus (which are changed every 2–3 months) which host a variety of food to tempt you.



There is a bar menu available from 12 noon through to 9pm.

Chef's specials are also available on most days and where possible are sourced from local produce.

Both menus are also available to non residents of the hotel, along with the use of both the lounge and

public bars which also serve tea and coffee throughout the day as well as a choice of real ales and a comprehensive selection of up to 50 Scottish single malt whiskies.

The restaurant area is also hired out for private functions such as weddings, birthdays and Christmas parties.





The Lochcarron Area

The Lochcarron Hotel is an ideal base for anyone who enjoys the outdoor life. A vast variety of activities is available including fishing trips. Boats, canoes, dinghies and fishing tackle are all available for hire locally.

- 9-hole golf course close to the village a short walk away from the hotel
- "Munro Bagging" - 32 Munros within a day's reach
- Fuar Tholl (2,790 feet/907 metres), known locally as "Wellington's Nose" (see below)

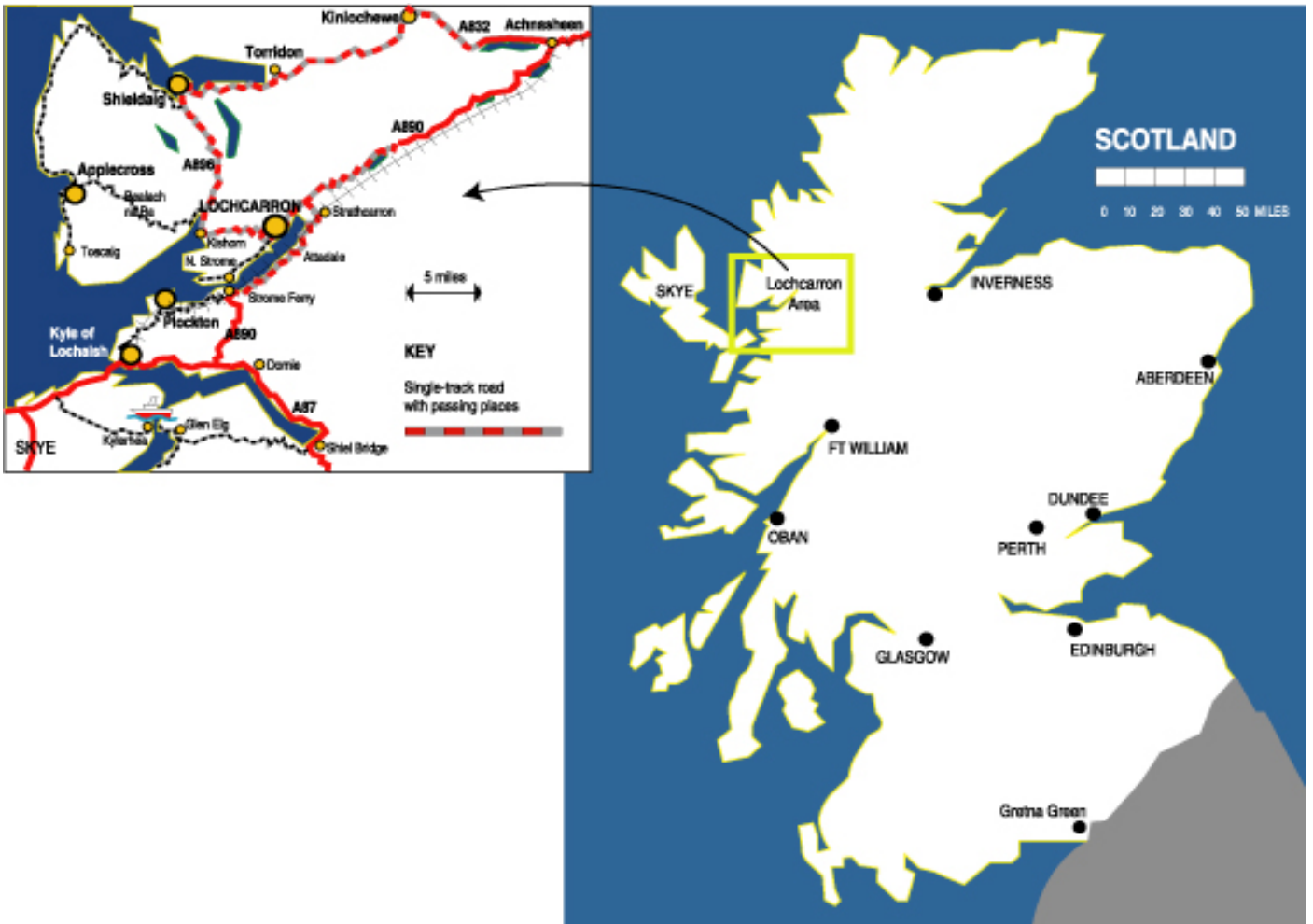


- Walking/hiking, bird watching, deer stalking, cycling (cycle hire available locally), pony trekking

- The magnificent Pass of the Cattle, one of the highest roads in Britain, climbing from sea level to 2,053 feet at its summit

 - ◆ A9 north to Tore
 - ◆ A835 to Garve
 - ◆ A832 to Achnasheen
 - ◆ A890/A896 to Lochcarron

- ◆ From Fort William:-
 - ◆ A82 north to Invergarry
 - ◆ A87 north west to Cluanie, Glen Shiel, Dornie, etc.
 - ◆ At Auchtertyre (3 miles after Dornie), turn right on A890/A896 to Lochcarron
